Major library issues:

The following new staff were hired during 2006/2007:

Two librarian positions became vacant with the resignation of the Cataloging librarian in May 2007 and the retirement of the Assessment librarian in August 2007. During 2006/2007, a Facilities Maintenance position was eliminated following a retirement and two clerical positions were cut, one a vacant position and the other a termination.

Budget cuts and inflationary increases also necessitated a \$100,000 reduction in the materials budget.

Institutional Changes:

President John Fallon was fired by the EMU Board of Regents in July 2007 and Don Loppnow was appointed Executive Vice President in August.

Elaine M. Logan was hired as the Associate University Librarian effective August 2007.
